Conophytums of Distinction with Matthew Opel, PhD

Program

Conophytum is one of the largest and most diverse genera of dwarf succulents in southern Africa, including more than 100 species of living stones, window-plants, lichen-mimics, soil-embed succulents, and very compact shrubs. University of Connecticut botanist Matthew Opel will provide a general introduction to Conophytum, including their varied forms, ecology, and cultivation. He will focus on especially beautiful, strange, or otherwise remarkable cultivars, varieties, hybrids and selections.
